Temporary Road and Detour Closure from the 200, 400, and 500 Blocks of Oakwood Street, SE, and the 3000 block of 4<sup>th</sup> Street, SE, For DC PLUG Feeder 15166 Begins August 12-17, 2024.

(WASHINGTON, DC) – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) advises stakeholders to expect delays due to upcoming road and detour closures for milling and paving on the 200, 400, and 500 blocks of Oakwood Street, SE between 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and 5<sup>th</sup> Street, SE, and 3000 block of 4<sup>th</sup> Street, SE between Orange Street, SE and Oakwood Street, SE. All residents will keep access to their homes. Please adhere to all NO Parking signs.

## TRAFFIC DETOUR

- 5<sup>th</sup> and Oakwood Street, SE- between Oakwood Street, SE and Newcomb SE- Traffic Detour—make a left onto Orange Street, SE -then a right onto 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, SE
- 2<sup>nd</sup> and Oakwood Street, SE between 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street—Traffic Detour-- Make a left onto 2<sup>nd</sup> and Newcomb Street, SE to Malcolm X Avenue, SE and then right onto Oakwood Street, SE

The road and detour closure are estimated to last 1 week for milling and paving (weather permitting). The restoration is necessary to complete the DC PLUG initiative's Feeder 15166 project which consists of undergrounding powerlines for a more resilient DC.
